HAPPY ST. PATRICK'S DAY!

In honor of St. Patrick's Day, here are a few **interesting facts about shamrocks and clovers!**

- The word **"shamrock"** comes from the Irish word "seamróg", which means "little clover". It is Ireland's most recognized National symbol.
- The **shamrock** is a three-leaved clover. A four-leaf clover is a deviation of the white clover plant and is considered rare and lucky. It is estimated there are approximately 10,000 three-leaf clovers for every four-leaf clover.
- According to the Guinness Book of World records, the highest number of leaves found on a **clover** is 14!
- The leaves of a four-leaf **clover** represent hope, faith, love and luck. A fifth leaf represents money, but there is no meaning yet for a sixth leaf or above.

Let's get ready for Spring, the garden is waiting for you!

First, trim off any damaged foliage on your trees and bushes. Next, weed all your beds. Now, fertilize all bushes, palms, citrus trees, and tropical fruit trees with a good palm fertilizer.

If you have a well-established vegetable garden, you should be feeding it often. I recommend a product called Tomato Maker. It's good for all vegetables and it's organic. We have this product on hand. Vegetables to plant now include tomatoes, watermelon, cantaloupe, okra, sweet potato, summer squash, and radish.

Good strong flowers to plant would be salvia vinca, begonias, torenia zinnia.
