The most important thing we need to do in March is to fertilize all our outdoor plants. Trees, bushes of all kinds, palms and groundcovers. We also fertilize citrus and all tropical fruit trees.

Vegetables to plant now include watermelon, cantaloupe, okra, sweet potatoes, summer squash, peppers. This is also a good time to plant herbs. The cooler temperatures help them grow better. Plant all your flowers now so they will be ready and looking nice for Easter.

All annuals are available and most perennials, they include Begonia, Vinca, marigolds, salvia, colus, kalanchoe, pentas, Lantana, coreopsis, milkweed.

Since March brings on dry wings, we must water more after and using mulch, helps with moisture.
