Hi, Everyone!

Wishing you all a Happy Summer and happy gardening!

We have a few things to do in June that are really important. First, we all know hurricane season is about to start, so trimming back your bushes and removing dead, woody limbs from your trees is a big help. You can still plant new trees but only small ones, no taller than 3'-8' tall. Keep to a fertilizer schedule of three times a year, March, June, October for all trees and bushes. Use a good palm food for everything except fruit trees and citrus, use a fertilizer specifically for them.

Flowers to plant now are full-sun, drought lovers, purslane, portulaca, vinca, Kalanchoe, beach Daisy. Shade lovers are Begonias, pentas, impatiens. Also, herbs do well in the shade in summer.

Vegetables to plant are heat tolerant eggplant, okra and a few small fruited tomatoes. If you have insects, use Neem oil or organicide, only spray in the evening.

Plant of the Month

Crape Myrtle



CRAPE MYRTLE
Lagerstroemia indica

This wonderful flowering tree is easy to grow. Buy your tree at this time of the year so you get the color you want. There are two varieties now, the large ones grow to 15' and the dwarf are 4'-5'. They bloom in late spring to late fall. They lose half of their leaves in winter. You can find at least 20-30 different colors. This tree has lots of nectar for bees and butterflies.
