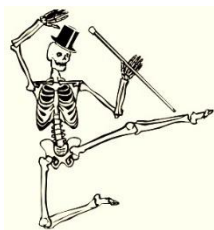

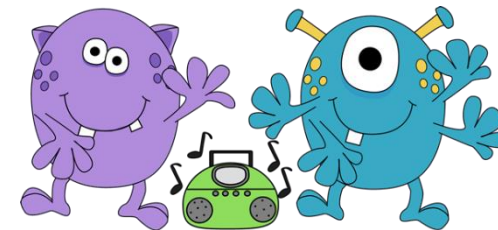

Hi, Everyone! Welcome to Fall!

I think October is a fun time in the garden, getting ready for the Holidays and mainly a change of weather. One important thing to do this month is to fertilize everything before winter comes. You won't fertilize again until March. I recommend a good palm food for the trees to bushes and liquid for all flowering plants.

For nice fall color, try some copper leaves, they're in at least 10 colors and they are beautiful in a container by your front door. For bedding plants, I would use Crossandra and lots of mixed marigold for good color.

For those planting vegetables, you're right on time. If you're a beginner at vegetables, try planting in a container, and just plant what you use.

### Plant of the Month

*Brunfelsia Pauciflora* (Yesterday-Today-Tomorrow)

This beautiful bush blooms, starting in fall, and stops in May. It's very full and grows 6-8', some varieties bloom off and on all year. It grows well in half sun and shade. Trim back after blooming and feed with palm food.
