If you haven't started a vegetable garden yet, it's not too late. It is cool enough now for cauliflower eggplant, cabbage, broccoli, tomatoes and snap beans. If you don't have space, you can grow any of these in big pots. A good sunny location is most important.

In December, we do have to worry about freezes, of course we don't get many, but it only takes one freeze to hurt everything. Make sure all of your plants are watered the night before and cover the plants with sheets or black plastic bags. They have to be removed the next day. Roses and any other hardy, woody plant like Ixora, Crotons and Podocarpus can be planted now.

Since the Poinsettia is our main flower for the holidays, I thought I would give a few tips on care for inside and outside. Inside, keep close to a window, the color will last for 2 months. Keep moist. Outside, protect them from full sun and windy areas. After the holidays, plant them in half sun and half shade. Enjoy them next year at this time.
