Plantation Garden Club and Other News

Thanks so much to **Sandy Fernandes** for volunteering to take over Roxie's spot in the newsletter. For the next few series of issues, she will provide some great summarized gardening tips she found in a garden guide by Bib Haehle and M.E. Depalma.

After a very warm February, here are a few gardening tips for a typical month of March:

- Fertilize everything--trees, shrubs, palms, citrus and groundcovers.
- Watch out for increasing bug populations such as aphids and mites, scale and thrips. I use soapy water but it's your choice.
- Cut back ornamental grasses.
- Mulch to suppress weeds. Remember to keep mulch 1-2 inches away from the stems and leaves so bark can breathe.
- Be aware that we can still get cold fronts and wind chills in the 30s so keep old sheets or some paper bags around in case you need to cover some of the tender plants up overnight. Never use plastic! Some blooming orchids may have to spend the night indoors too.
- Plant annuals, vegetables, trees, shrubs, palms and citrus but be aware of the weather and wait until cold fronts have cleared and weather is stable and fairly warm.


2019/20 Monthly Schedule
